

## RECTOR'S LETTER

## Achieving Greatness in God's Eyes

"For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exaled."
(Luke 14:11)

Jesus used these words to close a parable. He and others had been invited to dine at the home of a prominent Pharisee. As the invited guests were seating themselves, Jesus noticed that many of them were quick to take seats in the places of honor at the table and so, as he often did, he chose to use the occasion to teach his followers something about the kingdom of God. Jesus is talking here about recognition- about greatness. Our natural tendency as human beings is to want recognition. We want to feel that we matter that we are important. But Jesus reminds us that, in God's eyes, the source of true greatness is not recognition, but rather humility.

What motivates you? Is it to be recognized by those around you (family, friends, co-workers) as someone who is important? And how do you achieve recognition? Is it by the people you invite to dinner parties in your home? By the position you hold at work? By the position you hold at St. Peter's? When we stop worrying about things like where we sit and are simply interested in serving- then we are on the pathway to greatness. When we check our pride at the door (and that's what we're talking about here-pride) Jesus says that we are on the pathway to greatness. Do you want to be first? Then you must choose to be a servant...you must choose to take the last seat- not the first.

Dave Thomas, the late founder of Wendy's Hamburgers, never graduated from high school. He wrote in his book, <u>Well Done: The Common Guys Guide To Everyday Success</u>, "I got my MBA degree long before my GED. I even have a photograph of me in my MBA graduation gown- a snazzy knee length apron. I guarantee you that I am the only founder among America's biggest companies whose picture in the corporate annual report shows him wearing an apron and wielding a mop and plastic bucket. That wasn't a gag. It was a case of leading by example. At Wendy's, MBA doesn't mean Master of Business Administration. It means Mop and Bucket Attitude. It's how we define satisfying the customer through cleanliness, quality food, friendly service, and atmosphere."

Do you have your MBA yet- your Mop and Bucket Attitude? Are you on the path to true greatness? Jesus taught about it and people like Dave Thomas lived it. Understand, Jesus is not condemning working hard to move up. He's simply saying, let God do the promoting, let God blow the trumpets, don't do it yourself. Let your deeds and actions speak well of you- not your mouth. Start humbly and God will move you up. In the meantime, the best seat in the house is the seat of learning.
