





RECTOR'S LETTER

Christmas-Changing Human Behavior

A few years back, the University of Minnesota was having problems with Christmas Tree thefts. Thieves would sneak onto the campus in the middle of the night and saw down the school's evergreen trees. They lopped of the tops of several 18 foot trees that were more than 20 years old. The University decided to take action. They sprayed all their balsam firs, Scotch pines, and anything that could pass for a Christmas tree with skunk scent.....that's right- skunk scent! Cold weather masks the smell. But warm, indoor air releases it.

"We'll probably still lose some trees," the groundskeeper said. "But I have some satisfaction in knowing that things are not going to work out quite the way the thieves expected-especially when the warm, indoor air hits those trees." He did admit wondering, however, what the campus would smell like when the warm weather hit in the spring!

How do you change human behavior? Do you make the consequences so unpleasant that people never want to behave in that same way again? Possibly....but then why do so many people released from prison commit crimes again? Maybe something more is needed.

The Christmas story is an amazing story! The God of all creation became human flesh in a baby born in Bethlehem. But why? Why did God come down to where we are? And why did He take the form of a helpless baby? He did it because it was His way of changing the hearts and the behavior of people- people like you and me. His goal was not to overwhelm humanity and rob us of our freedom to choose. Rather, the object was to win our hearts and our souls in order to fashion a new creation. And God accomplished this by becoming one of us.

Sound mysterious? It's really not. Leaders in organizations today are constantly looking for ways to motivate their employees. They want people to enjoy their work enough that they will stay self-motivated without having them feel that they are being pressured by management to perform well. One way to do that is for management to meet the people where they are- to rid themselves of their vestments of power so that their presence will not intimidate.

God emptied Himself and became a human being. He set aside the privileges of deity and took on the status of a human. And having become human, He stayed human. It was an incredibly humbling process. He didn't claim special privileges. Instead, He lived a selfless and obedient life and then died a selfless and obedient death....and the worst kind of death at that- crucifixion.

God came down to lift us up. That is what Christmas is all about. And there was only one purpose: God's desire to change our hearts and so our behavior. This is the heart of Christmas. It was all for the purpose of making each of us a new creation. What a wonderful Christmas gift! The proper response to such a gift is to open ourselves and to let the love of Christmas fill our hearts and make us new. I pray you will do that this Christmas Season.
