Sunday School News

March 2013

What is "Lent" to a child? Did you know what it was all about when you were small? Kids have a hard time understanding Lent. Perhaps one way of explaining Lent is that it's a time to bring us closer to God. As teachers, we will explain Lent to your children, but the best teacher is the example set by you, their parents.

Lent is the season of preparation for Easter. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter. It lasts for 40 days (not including Sundays) in which Christians prepare for Easter by fasting and spiritual discipline - all for setting aside time to reflect on His sacrifices. Basically, Lent is a time for "spring cleaning" our lives while giving thanks to God. In our busy lives we fill ourselves with candy, buy toys, play video games and watch television which makes us happy but that happiness is temporary. During Lent we stop filling our lives with temporary happiness and make *more* room for God. Adults usually give up something important to them for the 40 days of Lent. Children, too can be encouraged to "fast" from fast food dinners and snacks, TV, internet, video games, movies, etc., and spend more time helping the poor in a variety of ways like donating items to a local thrift shop, food pantry, or toy drive. Money saved from fasting from movies, and such can be donated to charitable causes.

This year, let us all concentrate on making it more meaningful for us and our families. Let us teach our children when they are young to give to others, and let them know that Our Lord puts people all around us that we should serve in one way or another.

March 24th - Try to arrive by 9:30am to participate in the Palm procession in the sanctuary.

<u>March 31st</u> - Easter Egg Hunt – our annual Easter egg hunt will take place following the 10am service on Sunday, March 31st. Please bring an empty basket for your child to collect eggs.





RECTOR'S LETTER

The Faith To Move Mountains

A small congregation in the foothills of the Great Smoky Mountains built a new church on a piece of land that had been willed to them by another church member. Ten days before the new church was to be dedicated, the local building inspector notified the rector that the parking lot was inadequate for the size of the building and that, until the church doubled the size of the parking lot, they would not be able to use their new building. Unfortunately, the church had used every inch of the land except for the mountain against which it had been built. In order to build more parking spaces, they would have to "move the mountain" out of the back yard.

Undaunted, the rector announced the following Sunday morning that he would meet that evening with all church members who had "mountain moving" faith. They would hold a prayer meeting asking God to remove the mountain from the back yard and somehow provide enough money to have it paved and painted before the scheduled opening service the following week. Only twenty four of the congregation's 300-plus members showed up for the prayer meeting. They prayed for nearly 3 hours. At ten o'clock that evening, the rector said the final "Amen."

"We'll open next Sunday as scheduled," he assured everyone. "God has never let us down in the past and I believe he will be faithful this time, too."

The next morning, the rector was working in his study when there came a loud knock on his door. When he called, "Come in!" a rough looking construction foreman appeared, removing his hard hat as he entered the study.

"Excuse me, Sir. I'm from the Acme Construction Company over in the next county. We're building a huge shopping mall over there and need some fill dirt. Would you be willing to sell us a chunk of the mountain behind your church? We'll pay you for the dirt we remove and pave all the exposed area free of charge....if we can have it right away. We can't do anything else with the shopping mall until we get the dirt in and allow it to settle properly."

Well, the newly built little church was dedicated and opened the next Sunday, as planned, and there were far more members with "mountain moving" faith on that opening Sunday than there had been the previous week.... enough, in fact, to fill their newly expanded parking lot!

Some people think that faith comes from miracles. But others <u>know</u> that miracles come from faith.

Would you have gone to that prayer meeting? I hope so.
