Jim's Corner

n the February 2023 edition of The Call, I introduced you to the concept of the Neutral Zone and the idea that transition is a process by which people unplug from an old world and plug into a new world. Therefore, we can say that transition begins with an ending and finishes with a beginning.¹ I mentioned that there is a difference between change and transition, the former being situational and the latter being more psychological. Getting people through the transition is essential if the change is actually to work as planned.

To assist us in this transition from the resignation of Fr. Jesse to finding a new pastor, I have listened to the congregation and asked five members of the parish to form a Transition Team. These individuals are Bruce Comfort (Chair), Josie Jimeno, Dot Pierce, Linsey Shreve, and Bob Vanderslice. I will also be a team member

whose function will be to advise, assist, and be a resource, guiding the team with information and other resources. I am excited that these individuals have accepted the call to serve in this capacity. They represent different backgrounds, skill sets, age groups, and perspectives that reflect our congregation. They are also trusted by our members, and they are approachable. These are important qualities for a Transition Team.

This from the Interim Ministry Network Training Manual: "² The Transition Team is one of the key components of the Intentional Interim Ministry process. It is important to have a specific group that has no other agenda than to assist the Interim Minister and the congregation as they seek to use the time between settled ministers effectively.

The members of the Transition Team advise and consult with the Intentional Interim on a regular basis, communicate and bear witness to the fact that transition is ultimately the *work of the congregation* (emphasis added), and be available to hear the concerns of members of the congregation."

The Transition Team has specific responsibilities, which include, though are not limited to, the following. 3

- It meets regularly with the Interim Rector to assess needs, evaluate resources, set goals, determine priorities, and follow through on basic questions, and focus points for a congregation in an interim time.
- Have a representative present at each meeting of major decision-making groups to listen, answer questions, and perhaps report.
- Determine appropriate processes to facilitate congregational reflection regarding present and past happenings (as a means of planning for the future).
- Identify any areas of concern that need to be addressed during the interim time.
- Seek congregational input regarding areas of concern, and potential actions being suggested.
- Insure that any agenda of specific issues to be addressed during the interim time is adopted by the vestry.
- Identify individuals or groups within the congregation's membership needing additional attention, or carrying a special concern, and the best person or group to help address their needs or concerns.
- Share results of data gathered, and potential agendas developed with key leadership, the vestry, committees and congregation as needed,
- Work with appropriate committees and other ministries of the congregation to develop appropriate goals, and strategies (short and longer term) for the congregation's increased health.
- With the Interim Rector, and the Diocese of Southern Virginia representative, determine the appropriate time to activate a Pastoral Search Committee, and recommend the same to the vestry.

Now that the Transition Team has been formed, we will commission the Team at a 10 A.M. service in mid-April, after Easter. The date will be made known as soon as the Team members' schedules can be coordinated. I am asking you to make a special effort to attend this service to praise our Lord and show your support for the Team.

Obviously, the Transition Team is an important part of this process. So are you! The Transition Team cannot work without you. It will need your full support and cooperation as it works with me during this time. If and when parish events are planned to facilitate its work, please make every effort to participate, be present, and give your input to whatever it is that is being worked on. As English poet John Donne said, "No man is an island …"⁴ and each of you is a meaningful part of that island. To get through this transition time, each of us will need to be engaged in the process. Only in this way will we have a successful new beginning with a new pastor.



Vestry Meeting Minutes

February 13, 2023

Opening: The St. Peter's Vestry met together in the Diffenbaugh Library on February 13, 2023. Attending the meeting were Fr. Jim, Kimberly Truxell, Debbie Whitehorne, Bruce Comfort, Howard Belote, Judy Eller, Linsey Shreve, Vel Shreve, Peggy Pfeifer, Charlie Pfeifer, and Liz Kress (via Zoom).

Vestry Meeting Opening: The Vestry Meeting was opened with the beginning of the service of Evening Prayer led by Kimberly; Lector was Debbie Whitehorne.

Agenda: Fr. Jim asked all to look at the agenda for the evening and see if any changes or additions needed to be made before starting. Howard motioned to accept the agenda with revisions, and it was seconded by Vel. The agenda was accepted by acclimation.

January 2023 Minutes: The January 2023 Minutes were distributed to the vestry. Bruce motioned to accept the minutes with modifications, Linsey seconded. The minutes were approved with revisions.

Finance Report: Charlie reviewed the January Financial Report with the vestry.

The Cash Account Balances for January 2023 are as follows:

Operating Account:	\$16,184.54
Money Market Account	\$50,065.65
Composite Fund:	\$66,275.01
Total Net Assets:	\$134,979.86

The January 2023 Financial Report was approved, and the Vestry accepted it by acclamation.

Financial Committee Report: Charlie reported that he has been depositing all open plate cash into the Discretionary Account. Fr. Jim is recommending that open plate cash should only go to the Discretionary Account on the first Sunday of the month. It was agreed that we will shift to only the first Sunday of the month starting in December. The vestry agreed to the proposal.

<u>Rector's Report</u>: Fr. Jim expressed his regrets that he was not able to do a lot of outreach in January, but on the plus side his online Interim Rector training was finally completed. More work still needs to be done and will be handled accordingly.

Senior Warden's Report:

Dinner Planned for Wednesday, March 29th: Kimberly informed the vestry that they had the Wednesday Night in Lent dinner on the last night. She asked that they cook a Taco Soup. She also stated that she would send out via email all the ingredients needed to make it and everyone could sign-up that way.

Junior Warden:

<u>Security System</u>: The new security system for the front door to the office has been wired.

New Business:

<u>The Parochial Report</u> which was due by March 1st was completed and awaiting signatures to complete the filing. Fr. Jim, Peggy Pfeifer, and Charlie Pfeifer will sign it after the meeting and the final submittal will be made tonight by Laura. Jim explained what the Parochial Report was and who received the information.

The playground for the PreK-2 needs additional work before it will be available for the children. Bruce believes the ground around the equipment should be leveled and rocks/debris removed. He will get quotes from "Professional Landscapers" for solutions.

- <u>The Pancake supper</u> is up and running. The plan should be made for an attendance of approximately 60 persons. Rob, Judy, and Vel said they would be available to help.
- <u>Sign-ups</u>: Kimberly passed out 2 sheets for the vestry members to sign up for "Counting Duty" and "Evening Prayer" services for each Vestry meeting. Fr. Jim has offered to make a "Crib Sheet" for how to do Evening Prayer. Counting Duty would begin after each Vestry Meeting and end the Sunday prior to the next month's meeting. Kimberly will send an email with all the dates as they have been signed.
- <u>The Lenten Offering Envelopes</u> will be distributed as usual. This is the offering that will be earmarked for Shelly Ann's Cathedral repair fund. Laura will print out these envelopes, and they will be available for all by Ash Wednesday services.
- **First Sunday of the Month**, open plate (non-pledged money) will be deposited into the Church Discretionary Account. An announcement will be in the bulletin and in *The Call*.
- <u>Sunday School Security</u> will need to begin again on February 26, 2023. The front office door and the "Red Door" will need to be locked at 10:00 A.M. A sign should be placed on the doors announcing that the doors are locked for security purposes. A notice would be sent to all parishioners announcing when the doors would be locked and when they will be opened. A key to the Red Door should also be available to the ushers so they can access the church if the need arises.

Old Business:

<u>Pledges</u> Charlie stated that no new pledges had been received.

- **Front Door Security** Bruce expressed doubt that the new security system would be strong enough to make sure the front door closed. Also, a "Crash Bar" may need to be reinstalled on the Red Door as it is an "Emergency Exit" door. He is suggesting that we have a locksmith come out, inspect the system we have for the front door and tell us if it is reliable or should something else be installed too. And while he was here, he would also look at the Red Door to verify that it has all that is needed and to quote on changing that lock as the current key can no longer be duplicated. Bruce made the motion to approve having a 'Professional Locksmith" come out and give us an estimate on repairing/replacing three door (Front, Red and Parish Hall doors) locking systems. Howard seconded the motion. The Vestry approved by acclamation.
- <u>Grants</u> We have not yet applied for a grant to get assistance from the government to secure the entire church. Several classes are available and hopefully will be able to be attended. A professional to write the grant could cost approximately \$5,000.00. Reminder that the grant would be an "after the fact" grant.
- <u>Steeple above the parish hall</u> Bruce said that he had received four bids. There were three bids for the steeple and one for replacing the entire roof (which was last replaced in 1993 30 years ago). \$8800 approximately to repair and reseal the steeple in place, and the other bid was \$11,000± to remove and re-shingle the area. Another supplied an estimate for removing, repairing, and replacing for \$22,000. Feelings for removal were negative as pointed out that steeple was over the original church where the St. Peter's congregation moved until the current church was constructed. More bids will be received but the work, whatever it is, needs to be done soon as a new leak has developed in the kitchen area, as well as in the parish hall. Vel motioned that we accept the offer for \$8800 to repair only with resealing. The Vestry voted by acclamation to approve that proposal and work.

- <u>New Roof</u> Bruce also received a quote on replacing the roof on all three buildings. That amount came to \$50,000 for a roof shingle that has a Lifetime Guarantee. A word of warning came with this proposal that just last year, the estimate was \$38,000. The costs would keep increasing. An idea was presented that we may have to do a church-wide fundraiser. An article should be noted in *The Call*. "Save the Steeple" and "Raise the Roof" campaign!
- <u>Organizational Chart</u> Fr. Jim will work on the vestry organizational chart. Others volunteered to act as a liaison between ministry and vestry. Liz offered to be the one keeping a liaison between communications (Bob and Laura) and the vestry. This would be a new "Ministry"?
- <u>Card Ministry</u> Debbie brought up the issue of the vacancy in the Card Ministry. It was suggested that any member of the congregation could do this ministry. Kimberly suggested that Jeannine (Fr. Jim's wife) might take it over and she will ask her the next time she sees her.

<u>Fr. Jim</u> noted that Evangelization and Mission should be made into ministries.

- <u>**Transition Team</u>** Kimberly inquired about this team and Fr. Jim noted that they are still recruiting and building the team.</u>
- <u>Seder Dinner</u> will not be held this year. A potluck will be held in its place. Charlie mentioned that we should start now to make it an event in 2024.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned and closed with the conclusion of The Evening Prayer service.


