

Jim's Corner

he account of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ, in Luke 2:1-20 is probably the most loved and recited of the three gospel accounts, the other two being Matthew 1:18-2:1a, and John 1:1-18. Creches are ubiquitous and when one sees one. one immediately thinks of Christmas, the association is so strong. Most families have their unique Christmas traditions that are lovingly followed fifteen people in attendance, every year. As a child, I remember my mother cooking oyster fritters, scrambled eggs, bacon, and Christmas braided bread with dried fruit mixed in (which, one year, our dog ate before it was baked. The poor thing, she looked pregnant as the yeast was still active).

One of my most cherished memories of Christmas was the yearly arrival of our dear Canadian friends, the

Raskin family. Norm Raskin had known my parents since medical residency on Long Island, New York, and he became something like a second father to me (he used to call me Jimson). What was so special about Norm's family visit was that they were Jewish. So, on Christmas morning Norm would wear his signature stripped brown suit and play Santa Claus, distributing the gifts from under the tree to all including his wife, Sheil, and his two sons, Mel and Joey. You might imagine how wild it was to have so many in the house. When Hanukkah coincided with Christmas, we would participate in that observance as well. It's as though the sharing of our religious practices made the angels sing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased!" Luke 2:14

Today, Jeannine's and my traditions are more low-key. During Advent, we have two Advent calendars, a Noah's Ark calendar between the kitchen and the family room and a log cabin calendar in the sunroom. We alternate days opening the doors and windows to remove the animals or decorations. We usually have two trees decorated, one in the living room and one in the sunroom. After a big Christmas breakfast and Morning Prayer on Christmas Day, we open gifts in the living room listening to Christmas music in the background. Later in the afternoon, we view the Christmas classic video, *A Christmas Story*, starring Melinda Dillon, Darren McGavin, and Peter Billingsley. Later, Jeannine's son, Scott, and her grandson, Isaac, will come for a Christmas dinner of pizza, followed by exchanging gifts with them. We've developed the Christmas pizza tradition to make the day less stressful and hectic, saving the big dinner for the day after Christmas.

I have no doubt that you have your own traditions and warm memories of Christmases past. As the song says, "It's the most wonderful time of the year." Jeannine and I pray that each of you remember those traditions and experience the joy of knowing what the angel shared with us, "I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:10b-11




Racial Healing Workshop

Engage in transformative racial healing through our Diocesan Workshop, fostering empathy and understanding in a lifelong spiritual journey.





Vestry Meeting Minutes

October 9, 2023

Opening: The St. Peter's Vestry met together in the Diffenbaugh Library and via Zoom (due to Covid) on October 9, 2023. Attending the meeting were Fr. Jim Hunter, Charlie Pfeifer, Peggy Pfeifer, Vel Shreve, Linsey Shreve, Judy Eller. Via Zoom were Kimberly Truxell, Bruce Comfort, Laura Kallestad, Debbie Whitehorne, and Liz Kress.

Agenda: Fr. Jim asked all to look at the agenda for the evening and see if any changes or additions needed to be made before starting. Vel motioned to accept the agenda as is and Linsey seconded. Passed by acclamation.

<u>September 2023 Minutes:</u> Linsey added that she was absent from that meeting, and it was amended. Charlie motioned to accept the minutes as amended, Bruce seconded. The minutes were approved by acclamation.

September Financial Report: Charlie reported on the September Finance Report.

The Cash Account Balances for September 2023 are as follows:

Operating Account: \$44,603.55

Money Market Account \$40,074.05

Composite Fund: \$72,926.15

Total Net Assets: \$160,679.02

Peggy motioned to accept the September Financial Report and Vel seconded. It was approved by acclamation.

Rector's Report: Fr. Jim reported that he had 1 communion visit in September, and 1 hospital visit, and continued working with Lynn Farlin on the formation project.

Senior Warden's Report: Nothing to report.

<u>Junior Warden:</u> Sidewalk has been repaired. Bruce will be contacting Climatemakers about the thermostats in the church. They can only be set for weekdays and weekends not on individual days of the week.

New Business:

Electrical Problems: Laura and Debbie have the information regarding the "3 Phases" of the electrical system. It caused a disruption of power to the day school (1/2 of the school was without power). Robert Whitehorne (Parishioner) and Barry Connelly (Electrician) came out to inspect the problem and managed to fix it but they informed the office that all 3 phases need to be replaced – not repaired – and he is unable to do that kind of major work. It would shut us down for quite some time but needed to be done sooner rather than later. This also affects the church. It can not be accomplished one at a time. We will research some general contractors to give us estimates.

Stewardship Campaign: Should we ask some people to give a short talk about how and why they give to the campaign? The first letter will be sent out by October 19th.

Operation Christmas Child: Children in Sunday School will participate in this and have a "shoebox" for one girl and one boy. This may be opened to the congregation if anyone wants to participate. Debbie will have all the information available. It will need to be returned to Debbie by the 12th. Each box will also require \$10 for shipping and handling. This will be in addition to the angel tree. The Day School will also participate in this, at least one box for a boy and one for a girl. A notice will be placed in the bulletins and in *The Call*.

Old Business:

1. Search Committee: The Vestry could serve, but it would be more effective to have a separate committee, and they would present candidates for the position to the Vestry. Most of the parish profile could be written in advance of the Vestry retreat scheduled for February 3rd, 2024. One priority is to decide if we will have a separate committee or if the vestry will BE the Search Committee.

The Search Committee will also be the one to complete the profile. If anyone would like to speak to someone about serving, they should speak with Fr. Jim before approaching them. It should be a varied demographic of people who serve.


- 2. **Sexton**: Antonio will work with us as a "handyman." He will be hired as an "on call" worker and should be paid as a "1099 Contractor" rather than a "Sexton". We would have to be flexible with the time a project needed to be done.
- 3. Cleaners: Floors in the Parish Hall and two hallways will be stripped and waxed on October 12th. We need to have felt put on the bottoms of all tables and chairs in the parish hall to ensure the floors are not scratched up when they are moved into place. Debbie and Laura will purchase.
- 4. **Interim Ministry Update:** Not much to say as all the meetings have been attended/watched by all, and it is going along smoothly.
- 5. **Trustees:** Charlie attempted to bring the forms to the courthouse, and they needed a change in the way it was presented. Charlie will go down again this week with the corrected forms.
- 6. **Bylaws:** Charlie has made an attempt to conceptualize a set of bylaws for the church. He has been working with the canons of the Diocese and adapting for our individual needs as a church. Charlie will continue to work on them.

The next Vestry meeting will be November 13, 2023.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed with the remainder of the Evening Prayer service and then adjourned.

St. Peter's Church was organized in 1885 and the cornerstone was dedicated September 5th, 1886. This structure still stands on Brown Avenue in Norfolk.
