And to have a 9AM service starting in Oct. 2020, with the first Sunday of each month being Rite I. Each service will be with Eucharist if a supply priest can be found, or Morning Prayer if no supply priest can be found. Below you will find a schedule for Sept. and Oct. We will continue to live stream the services for those that choose not to attend. We, as a vestry, felt that this is the best solution to accommodate both the 10am and the 8am parishioners.
